Shannon R.F.C. A look back at their first season in the All Ireland League

As Club Captain Pat Murray so rightly said before the first ball was even kicked, 1990/91 was always going to be the most important season in the history of Shannon R.F.C.

After years of deliberating, debate and counter debate, the All Ireland League became a reality and totally vindicated itself by producing Rugby of outstanding quality, supported by huge crowds, throughout the country. Life in Division One was never going to be easy but despite early relegation jitters, the Shannon lads managed to

secure their place for next year with a splendid 11 points to 7 victory over St. Mary's at Thomond Park on Saturday January 12th. They didn't stop battling until the final whistle blew, eventually finishing a very respectable fourth and they'll have high hopes for 1991/92. Shannon may have played second fiddle in the media to Garryowen and the newly promoted Young Munster for much of the season but exacted their revenge on Sunday February 3rd. with a dramatic 13 points to 12 victory over Young Munster in the Charity Cup. This inspired performance prompted Pat Murray to comment they've finally sorted out their pack problems, the influx of new players adding much needed strength and determination to the scrum. Coach Ger McMahon must take credit for a great deal of the club's recent success. Ger, himself an outstanding player before serious
