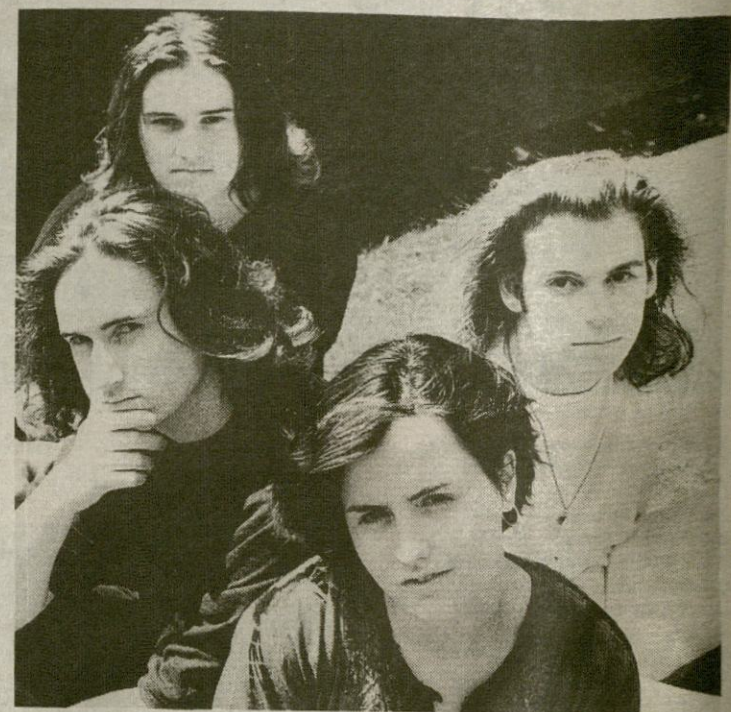

NEWS

CRANBERRIES TOUR

THE CRANBERRIES, who are set to release a new single, "Dreams", at the end of the month, have lined up a massive UK tour, starting at the end of this month and taking them through the whole of next. "Dreams", which, as The Maker exclusively revealed last week, is the band's first single in almost a year, comes from the band's forthcoming album, "Everyone Else Is Doing It, Why Can't We?" which is released by Island to coincide with the tour. The shows start at Wick Assembly Rooms on September 12, continuing at Trowbridge Psychic Pig (29), Stevenage Bowes Lyon House (30), London Marquee (October 1), Oxford Jericho Tavern (2), Leicester Princess Charlotte (4), Derby Dial Club (5), Canterbury Expose (6), Bristol Tropic (7), Newport TJs (8), Chelmsford Y Club (9), Hull Adelphi (10), Tamworth Arts Centre (11), Brighton Sussex University (14), London Marquee (15), Worcester Arts Centre (16), Exeter Cavern (17), Glasgow Apollo (19), Aberdeen Lemon Tree (20), Edinburgh Venue (21), Newcastle Riverside (22), Middlesbrough Arena (23), Manchester University (24), Leeds Duchess Of York (26), Southampton Joiners (28), London Marquee (29), Northampton Irish Centre (30), Coventry Polytechnic (31) and London Marquee (November 12).



RUBICON, the band formed by the four members of Fields Of The Nephilim after Carl McCoy's departure, release their debut single on September 14 on Beggars Banquet. Available on 12-inch only, it features "Watch Without Pain", accompanied by "Inside Your Head" and "Before My Eyes". The single is produced by Rubicon and Mark Freeguard. The group play a one-off gig at Manchester University on September 15 as part of the In The City seminar. They play their first UK tour in October.

THE LUNACHICKS have added another handful of UK dates to the end of their current European tour. The shows precede the release of their debut LP, "Binge And Purge", at the end of September, on Safe House Communications through Caroline. Dates are: Leeds Duchess Of York (September 9); Newport TJs (10), London New Cross Venue (11), Harlow Square (12) and Brighton Zap Club (13).



JACOB'S MOUSE, the Suffolk-based band whose "No Fish Shop Parking" LP was met by widespread critical acclaim, return with a four-track EP for Wiiija at the end of the month. It's called "Ton Up" and tracks featured are "Oblong", "This Room", "Fridge" and "Motorspare". To coincide with the release, the band play two shows. They've got a lunchtime gig at the Covent Garden Rough Trade shop on September 12, followed by a night-time show at the London Islington Powerhaus Club Smeashed (14). The band said this week: "We thought the Rough Trade Shop would be a great place to play an all-ages show. It's the only place where under-18s can regularly get in to see bands, and it's free." The band are currently working on a cover of an old World Domination Enterprises song for a Rough Trade Singles Club release in the next couple of months. There'll be news of more dates soon.

THE SUNDAYS release their new single, "Goodbye", on Parlophone on September 21. Produced by songwriters Harriet Wheeler and David Gavurin, with engineer Dave Anderson, it's taken from their new album, "Blind", which comes out at the end of October - as exclusively revealed by The Maker a month ago. "Goodbye" is backed with another new track, "Noise", plus a cover of the Stones' "Wild Horses". Neither of these tracks will be on the album.

THE LEMON TREES, the band formed by ex-World Party keyboardist Guy Chambers, release their debut single, "Love Is In Your Eyes", next week. The band are on the road to support the release. They play shows at Bath Moles Club on September 26, Portsmouth Wat Wedgwood Rooms (27), Clapham Grand (MTV show - 28), Glasgow King Tut's Wah Wah Hut (30), Manchester University (October 1), Birmingham Polytechnic (2) and Kingston Polytechnic (3).

THREE & A HALF MINUTES follow up the critical acclaim that greeted their "Peep" EP with a handful of shows this month. They play Bedford Esquires on September 12, Derby Wherehouse (21), Leicester Princess Charlotte (23) and Manchester Boardwalk (29).

FEARGAL SHARKEY has signed to Polydor - as an A&R man! The former Undertones vocalist, who scored a solo Number One single in 1985 with "A Good Heart" and returned to the singles chart last year with "I've Got News For You", has recently been without a recording contract after being dropped by Virgin. A Polydor spokeswoman last week declined to comment on Sharkey's change of career, but said: "It is certainly true that he's joined us."

JOHN LENNON'S FBI file looks set to be made public after the US Supreme Court last week rejected an appeal by the Bureau against an earlier court ruling in favour of a lawsuit demanding access to the file. The FBI is now legally obliged to hand over the documents by September 11. The file was compiled by the Nixon administration in 1972, in response to fears that Lennon would attempt to organise a demonstration against the Vietnam war at the Republican Party Convention. The American Civil Liberties Union, who launched the lawsuit, have stated that they believe the file contains allegations about Lennon's sex life and drug habits alongside immigration and tax documents, analyses of Lennon's lyrics, "reviews" of his live shows by FBI agents, interviews with his associates, and even reports on the contents of the rubbish bins outside his New York home!

THE FRANK AND WALTERS have added three dates to their forthcoming tour, at Hull Adelphi (September 14), Manchester University (15), and Peterborough Arena (October 6). The Manchester date, part of the "In The City" seminar series, will be broadcast live on Radio 1's Mark Goodier show between 8:30pm and 9pm.

BOB MARLEY'S four-album boxed set, "Songs Of Freedom", is set for release by Tuff Gong via Island on September 28. Among the previously unreleased tracks in the 78-song compilation are three recently discovered studio recordings, "High Tide Or Low Tide", "Iron Lion Zion" and "Why Should I", plus numerous remixes and live recordings, including a live version of "Redemption Song", taken from the singer's last-ever show. Rareties include Marley's earliest recordings, made in 1962. The CD version is a numbered limited edition: one million copies are to be manufactured for worldwide sale. The collection will also be available on cassette, and both formats will retail for under £30.

THE BEAUTIFUL SOUTH have a new single, "36D", set for release by Go! Discs on September 14. B-sides on all formats are two new songs, "Throw His Song Away" and "Trevor You're Bizarre".

CARTER USM, Suede, The Frank And Walters and Buzzcocks will all be interviewed live on XFM Radio during the first few days of the station's second month-long series of broadcasts, starting on September 13. Carter will appear on Gary Crowley's morning show on September 15, and Buzzcocks can be heard on the same show on September 17. The Frank And Walters join Janice Long on her afternoon show on September 17, while Suede sashay in for a chat with Steve Lamacq during his "Drive Time Show" on September 17. Meanwhile, a few tickets are still available for XFM's "Celebration" at the Town And Country Club on October 11. The £7 ticket price includes a free tee-shirt, and the station promises a mystery guest band on the night. Tickets can be obtained from XFM at 97 Charlotte Street, W1, and cheques should be made payable to XFM.

CUD release a new single, "Once Again", on A&M on September 28. It's a re-recorded version of a track from the LP "Seven-inch" LP. Seven-inch and cassette copies are backed with "Day By Day" - Cud's interpretation of a song from the musical "Godspell". Extended formats also feature acoustic re-recordings of "Eau Water" and "Soul Food".

Meanwhile, two extra dates have been added to the band's forthcoming tour. They play Stirling University (October 3) and York Hideaway (22). The show at Exeter University has been brought forward one day to October 13.

The Family Cat will support on all dates except the two opening shows in Ireland. They will release a new single to coincide, and details will be announced next week.

MONSTER MAGNET have a new single, "Evil", set for release by Glitterhouse on September 14 - and the same day also sees the UK release of their album "Tab", previously available only on import. The seven-inch format is a limited edition of 2,000 copies on multi-coloured vinyl, and is backed with "Elephant Bell". 12-inch and CD formats also feature the nine-minute bonus track "Spine Of God". The single features new guitarist Ed Mundell, who replaced John McBain after the band's recent dates supporting Soundgarden.

IAN MacNABB has been added to the MTV "120 Minutes" Music Festival, sponsored by The Maker. He headlines at the Clapham Grand on September 26 - replacing The Family Cat, who have pulled out due to European commitments. Support comes from Anna and Medici Slot Machine, and tickets are on sale now priced £6.

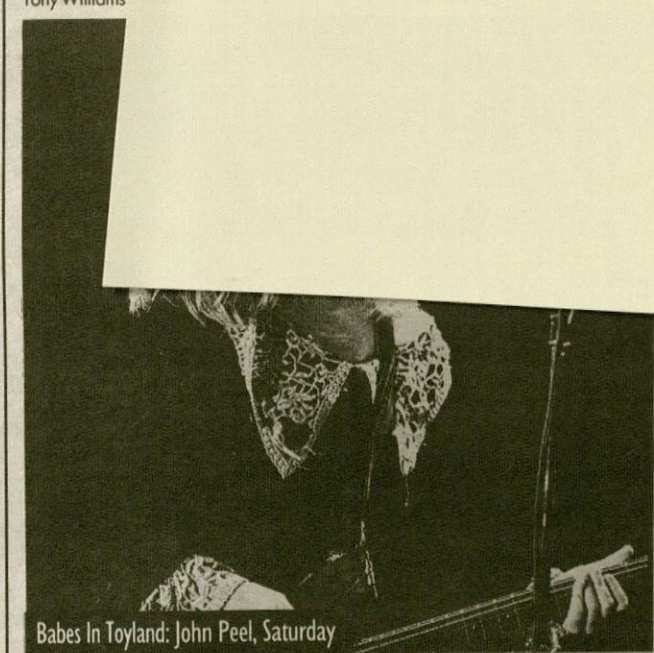

 DOING for Washington what "The Player" did for Hollywood, Robbins' debut as director is a razor sharp, savage satire on the US political system, and a timely one at that. The gangly Robbins is letter perfect as the eponymous Roberts, a right-wing Dylanesque singer with a predilection for fencing (and a shady past) who stands for senate and convinces a gullible electorate to Vote Bob. The sublimely suave Alan Rickman is his cut-throat advisor, Gore Vidal his brow-beaten opponent and Giancarlo Esposito the fanatical hack out to nail him. Highly recommended.

"CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS: THE DISCOVERY"

 THE first of three Columbus movies coming at ya over the course of the next two months, this is best described as "not the Gerard Depardieu one". Unknown French actor George Corraface took over the title role three days before filming commenced after Timothy Dalton jumped ship. Smart move, Timbo. With Tom Selleck and Rachel Ward as King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella of Spain, Catherine Zeta Jones as Columbus' mistress and an embarrassingly bumbling Marlon Brando as Torquemada, this lumbering relic perversely proves to be a damn sight funnier than the forthcoming "Carry On Columbus" (MS)

"LES AMANTS DU PONT-NEUF"
 Director: Leos Carax
 DIRECTED for the most part with an off-beat, vibrant urgency and a deliciously disorienting sense of time and place, this heady and eventually tragic love story is visually arresting, if narratively naive. However, the audacity and lyricism of Carax's imagery salvages a script that veers wildly from the profound to the prosaic.
