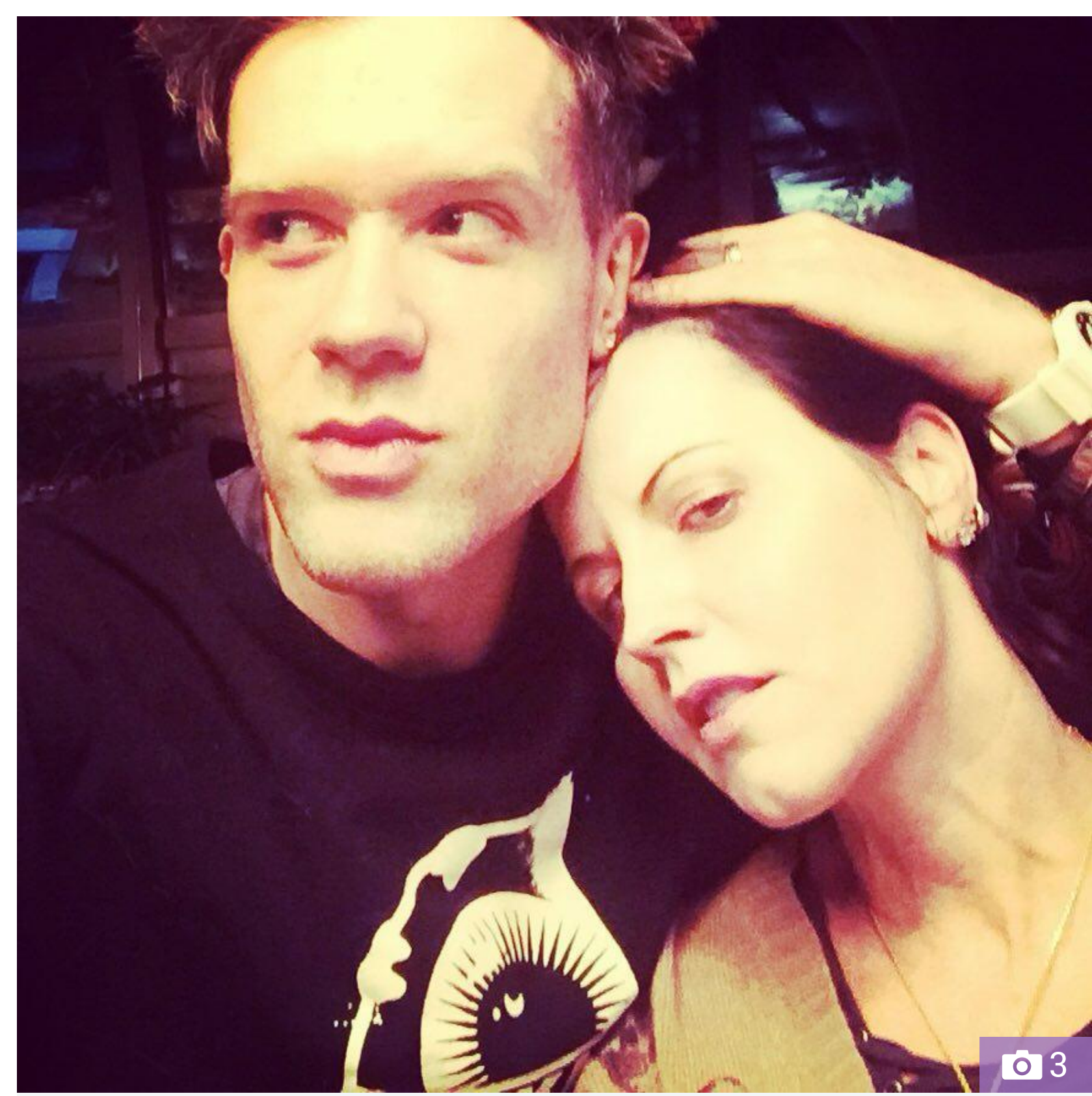
Dolores O'Riordan's post-mortem results are expected today

The tragic Cranberries singer was found dead in her London hotel bathroom by a maid on Monday morning.

It is understood Dolores' family are still in the dark over the cause of the superstar's sudden death.

Dolores' boyfriend last night said his heart is "broken and beyond repair" following her sudden death earlier this week.

Ole Koretsky, who played with the Limerick woman in rock band D.A.R.K, added that he had lost the love of his life.

The New York-based DJ and producer wrote on the group's website: "My friend, partner, and the love of my life is gone.

"Dolores is beautiful. Her art is beautiful. Her family is beautiful. The energy she continues to radiate is undeniable.

"I am lost. I miss her so much. I will continue to stumble around this planet for some time knowing well there's no real place for me here."

The couple's D.A.R.K. bandmate, Andy Rourke — former bassist of The Smiths — added he was "devastated" by her death.

He said: "I have truly enjoyed the years we spent together and feel privileged to call her a close friend.

"It was a bonus to work with her in our band D.A.R.K. and witness firsthand her breathtaking and unique talent. I will miss her terribly. I send my love and condolences to her family and loved ones."

Her niece, Elaine O'Riordan, has told of the family's "shock and sadness" at her sudden death.

She wrote: "Words can't describe the shock and sadness, we are all feeling.

"Watch over Dad, Nana and all your brothers and sisters and kids. It's going to be a very tough road ahead at your loss, we all love you xxx.
