Singer Liam Ó Maonlaí has paid an emotional tribute to Dolores O'Riordan, saying it is "just impossible to believe that she's gone".

The Hothouse Flowers frontman was a guest on *The Marian Finucane Show* on RTÉ Radio 1 on Saturday, where he joined host Brendan O'Connor, The Devlins' Peter Devlin and Le Galaxie's MayKay in remembering the late Cranberries singer, who died earlier this week.

The Cranberries, Ó Maonlaí told listeners, had toured with the Hothouse Flowers when they were starting out.



"Somebody had played me *Linger*, and so I'd been made aware of it," Ó Maonlaí recounted. "And then the next thing there they were on tour. And there she was. This incredible, beautiful, freckled, dark, deep-eyed - very deep-eyed - feisty [woman]."

"And love," he added. "She had a particular type of love that she emanated and we are now


savouring that. And thankfully love lives. And just for her family, like... She was loved, and she loved."




