THE PLAY

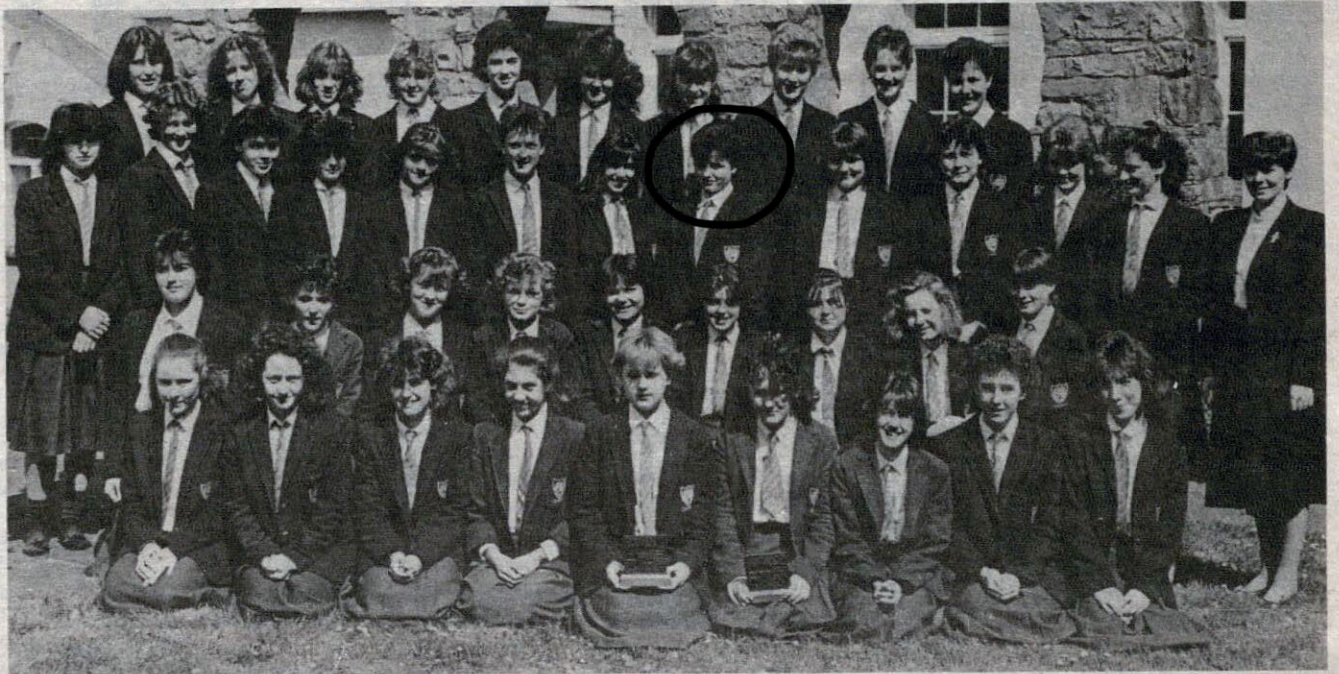

You have eight tricks on top and your only hope of making two more may come from a favourable lie of the diamond suit. Assume the likely 4-3 break and hope the queen is where you want it. So at trick four win with the ace of clubs and play a small diamond finessing the knave, now ruff a small diamond in hand, this establishes the diamond suit.

Draw three rounds of trumps ending in dummy with the queen. You can now discard your losing clubs on the diamond suit. 4 spades made.
