THE BUZZ Limerick's Nite Life Scene

HITZ'N'BITZ BY SHANE FOLEY Mixed weekend at the Royal!

WITH all line-up details completed and physical preparations due to start in earnest on Friday morning at 8 o'clock, Limerick's People In Need Telethon Rock looks like it could well be the centrepiece from which many of the city's side shows will revolve around.

The venue for this four band 'live' outdoor extravaganza is Lower Cecil Street — the stage should be set up somewhere in the vicinity of the GPO — and it is extremely probable that a large crowd will turn up to show their appreciation.

The four participating bands are Joe Browne And The Dirty Dawgs, The Charming, World Spirit Mood and the very headliners The Cranberries. This line-up is a mixture of the young but established, the very established but not so young and the up and coming!

The music kicks off at 8 p.m. and, to be honest, it should have something to stop and grab the attention of even the most uninterested passer-by. By the way, it will definitely finish no later than 11.10 p.m. — plenty of time to get one or three in at your favourite watering hole or to get yourself well primed for attendance at the nite club of your choice.

The line-up, as the bands will appear, is Joe Browne & Co., The Charming, World Spirit Mood and The Cranberries.

Joe Browne needs little or no introduction to Limerick music fans and his excellent brand of country rock should be just the thing to get proceedings under way.

Joe's spirited, sometimes coarse but always powerful vocals and the very substantial backing of the Dirty Dawgs always ensure that each and every one of their outings leaves you feeling like you've seen and heard something special.

A run out for this well drilled crew in an outdoor setting could be something well worth seeing.

Next up are local newcomers The Charming. Having recently completed a session for Dave Fanning's highly prestigious 2FM Rock Show, they are, I believe, at present receiving some very favourable enquiries from all the right places.

If their debut three-track demo, Never Know, is anything to go by then they look like a group who might possibly aspire to greater things.

That demo is, I'll have to admit, probably one of the only local demo tapes that I've continued listening to long after the necessary 'reviewing' listens had been finished with.

The three tracks included, "Never Know," a cracker of a song; "Something Blue," another totally superior effort, and "Make No Mistake," the track that most impressed me at first but which has since — along with the other two — become almost a weekly listen, are well worth shouting about.

The Charming are a band to watch for; Magda's vocals are well worth listening out for, and they deserve your support!

World Spirit Mood are a band who first came to my attention courtesy of their very fine inclusion, "Last Waltz," on the Limerick Rocks '92 cassette. A four-piece from Ennis who're only together since September of last year, World Spirit Mood have, according to their press release, "more energy than the Starship Enterprise."

That last rather extravagant boast is sorta borne out by the almost phrenetic speed with which they set about "Last Waltz" . . . you won't catch any O.A.P.s 'last waltzing' to this one!

They've played quite a few times in Limerick and recently finished a series of Mid-West gigs with a lunchtime show at the RTC in Galway.

If "Last Waltz" is a taste of what's to follow then these guys should be another band worth seeing on Friday night.

Last, but by no means least, come show headliners The Cranberries. Signed to Island Records and with the excellent four-track Uncertain EP behind them, The Cranberries who've been rather quiet of late — must surely have a fine future ahead of them.

Dolores O'Riordan, the group's lead vocalist, is one more in a long line of very talented Irish female vocalists to get recognition and her excellent ability, coupled with the very fine musical goings-on provided by Noel and Mike Hogan and Fergal Lawlor, have earned them some superb press both at home and abroad.

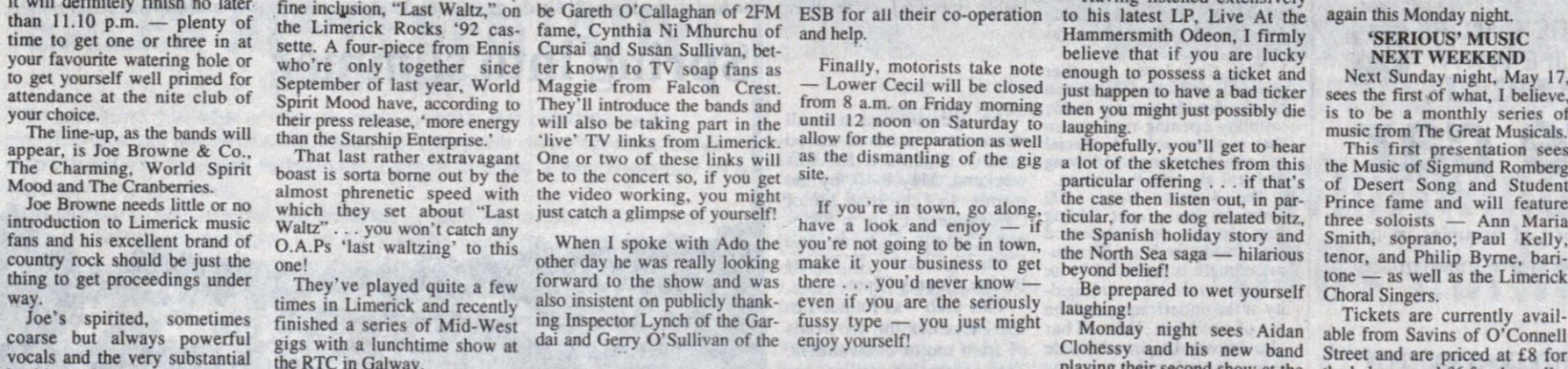
The debut album is, of course, eagerly awaited and this is really a great chance to see the band perform 'live' — after all, it's been quite a while since they last did it 'live'.

The Cranberries are worthy headliners and, for their dedicated fans, the possibility of hearing some new material must be like dangling the proverbial carrot!
