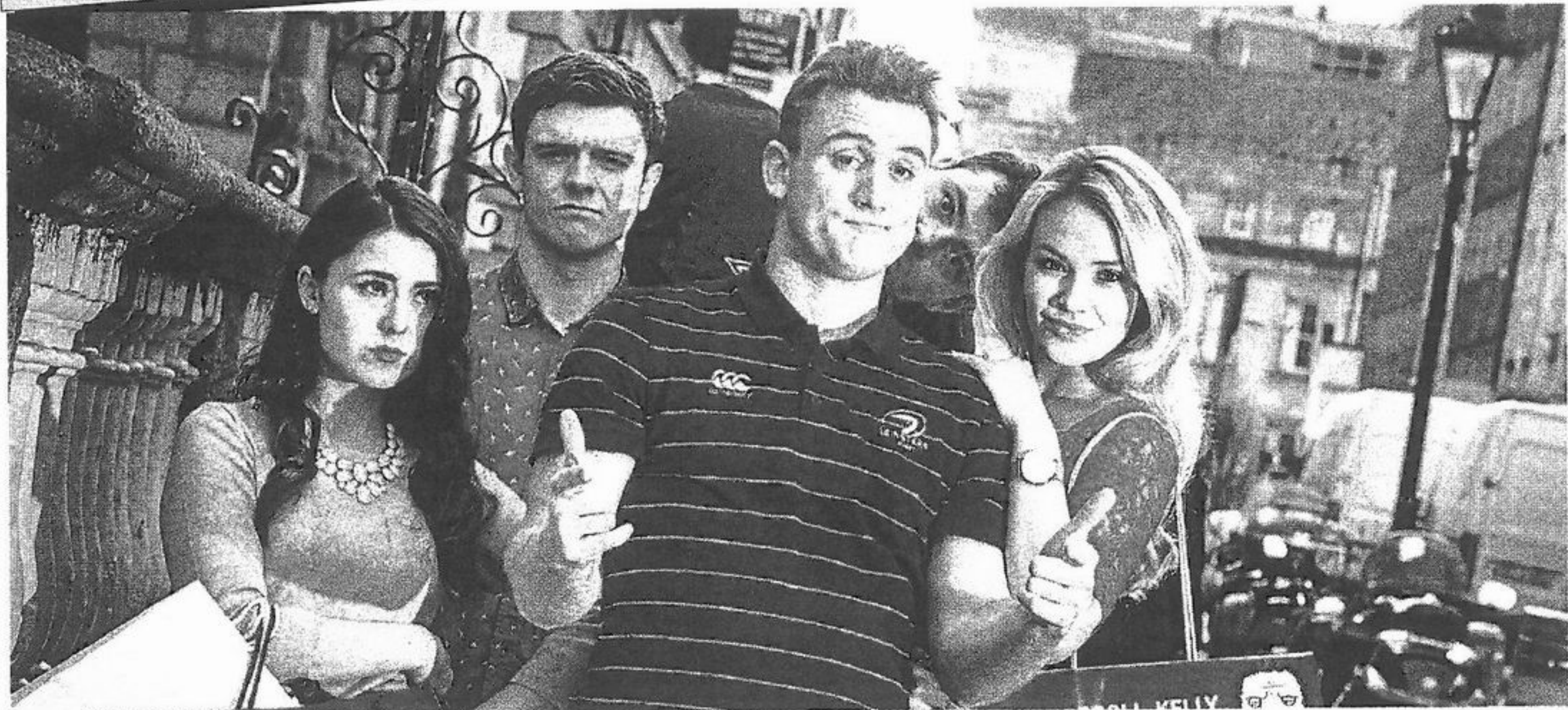

Dolores goes D.A.R.K. for May

CRANBERRIES' star Dolores O'Riordan is to make a comeback to a Limerick stage in May, in an unlikely collaboration with The Smiths' bassist Andy O'Rourke and New York DJ and producer Olé Koretsky.

D.A.R.K. is the result of a collaboration between the trio, which will result in an album, *Science Agrees*, released on the Cooking Vinyl

label on May 27, with the band to play a show in Dolan's Warehouse on Friday, May 13. Tickets are on sale now.

According to the press material, D.A.R.K.'s roots lie in a New York DJ-mixing collaboration formed between Andy and Olé, after they met gigging in Washington DC and later met O'Riordan.

All three of them arranged and produced the album: a concoction created in NYC

and Ontario, mixed in California and mastered in London. The first single to be released from the album is available to be listened to online now.

The move comes as The Cranberries gear up for several European shows in June, allowing O'Riordan to put the turbulence of recent months behind her, and with the sneaking suspicion that the band could yet play a gig in Limerick this summer.
