



Guitar intro: close up of CD with butterfly picture being put into CD player (shot continues)





Guitar intro:

(shot continues) pan up to close up of Pelores putting headphones over ear. Shot pulls out and reveals Pelores' face



Guitar Intro: (First Location) High Wide shot of Delores walking down steps outside apartment with about 5 to 10 people milling about. She walks past parked cars and kids playing as cars pass by on street. "There was a game we used to play / We would hit the town on Friday night"



Verse 1: Delores lip syncs as she walks away from apartment as people mill around behind her.





Verse 1: (second location: factory setting)A single butterfly flies into the scene. Pelores takes notice as the butterfly flutters around her head. The animated butterfly is an accent of color amongst the gray surroundings.

"And stay in bed until Sunday"



Verse 1: (Multiple Shots - CU/Med/Long)
Camera mixes scenic "beauty" shots and shots that
track with Delores.

"We were living for the love we had and"



Verse 1: The butterfly lands on her finger



Verse 1:

Five or more butterflies enter frame. Delores gently tosses the first butterfly in the air. The camera favors the sky) We have moved away from the factory setting, out into a blue sky as the first "fantasy" begins. Her headphones have dissapeared.



Instrumental:

Hundreds of butterflies take flight in the distance. The sky becomes filled with thousands of butterflies. The camera mixes fantastic wide shots and intimate closeups. "It was just my imagination" x 3



Chorus 1:

(headphones are gone) Several Butterflies swarm around Pelores. She playfully interacts, twirls etc. within the fantasy.



Instrumental:

A pedestrianenters the fantastic world and interrupts Pelores (with headphones back on). We see the butterflies and blue sky magically zap away taking the scene back to the location. She takes headphones off.



Instrumental: Close Up of pedestrian reacting to Pelores, who is giving directions to him

"I have always kept my faith in love,"




Verse 2: Velores walks along and continues singing on a grassy knoll

"There was a time I used to pray"



Verse 2: (Multiple Shots - CU, Med, Wide) A variety of shots show her walking again through factory surroundings. She replaces headphones and begins singing.

"It's the greatest thing from the man above,"




Verse 2: Wide shot of grassy knoll with factory in background and hot air balloon floating in foreground




Verse 2: Close up of Pelores looking up at balloon in the distance



Verse 2: Wide Shot of the balloon near her, (on location) as Pelores gets into basket




Pelores notices a hot air balloon getting even closer



Chorus 2: C.V. of Pelores in the basket.




Chorus 2: C.V. of Pelores face looking out from basket. No headphones.



2nd Instrumental (x2):


In the background the blue sky fades to a child-like drawing of puffy clouds etc. We catch glimpses of the horizon (child-like drawings) as hundreds of balloons float amongst Pelores' basket.

Chorus 2:


(headphones are gone?) Close shot of Delores lifting. (Shoot in a studio against blue screen) The background gray is replaced with a blue sky. We see more balloons in the distance.




2nd Instrumental (x2): (Multiple Shots)

We see a variety of wide and tight shots with Pelores in her basket, as more balloons take flight in the back ground. (possibly shoot other band members in a basket for compositing around Pelores)

2nd Instrumental (2x): Thousands of balloons clutter the sky



2nd Instrumental (2x):

The Balloon fantasy is zapped away, replaced with Delores in the middle of an intersection (with headphones). The illustrated car is replaced with a real car that has just hit its brakes.



2nd Instrumental (2x):
An illustrated car comes out of nowhere and heads for Delores as if to crash



2nd Instrumental (2x):

The driver and passenger (band members?) shakes fist. Cut away to reactions of band members and car driver.



2nd Instrumental (2x):
Pelores takes off her head phones and crosses the street.

We'll always be this free / We will be living for the love we have / Living not for reality"




Verse 3: The background slowly fades to white and Pelores (shot on blue-screen over neighborhood) fades to a high contrast black and white look (head phones are gone) which will simulate the look of the black and white film stock.




Verse 3:Pelores replaces her head phones as she walks on through the surroundings. Neighborhood people mill about.



Chorus 3: A microphone (composited element) and the band slide into frame to create a wide shot of them performing.




Chorus 3: Elements and band members come on and off screen via post fades/slides/wipes etc., creating a look of a 60's credit sequence (excluding titles). We need to shoot a library of elements for post.




Chorus 3:


Outro choruses:

Graphic performance continues, possibly overlaid with macro close shots of flowers opening in time-lapse photography. Each flower dissolves into a different flower and different color. An added painterly texture may give the flowers the same texture as the butterflies and hot air balloons.



Outro choruses:

Continue to revisit previous scenes until we fade the entire trippy visual back to reality. Velores fades back to color and the gray location fades into the background. Headphones are back on.



Outro choruses:

The layering of flowers will color tint the high contrast performance footage and create a trippy effect. Eventually we may mix in butterflies and hot air balloons to create a collage of animated movement and layers.



Outro choruses:

A wide shot bookends the video. Possibly an accent of a single butter-fly over the shot?
