Review

Barefoot in the Park, by Neil Simon, at The Compass Theatre

THIS play was saved by two of the main characters, who countered the rest of the cast's tendency to ham it up.

The plot follows four central characters - a newlywed couple finding married life less than complete bliss, the bride's mother and the eccentric who lives upstairs, Eileen

Smith was excellent as the snobby mother, Mrs Banks, and gave the most convincing performance. Her comic timing was responsible for most of the humour in the production, while Michael Guerin was charmingly lascivious as the sprightly Victor Velasco and these two held the play together.

Doona Carey, playing bride Corrie Bratter, was convincing towards the end, but early on was rather an American sit-com type wife.

Jeff Eales, as her bolshie husband Paul, was rather overpowering by maintaining the same volume whatever his lines, and his impression of a drunk needs some polishing.
