PRISON CAKE SECRET REVEALED

THE TREATY Stone Cake — a fundraising novelty organised by the Limerick Prison Officers fund-raising committee — weighs 12.45 kilos or 27½ lbs.

Thousands of people in Limerick were asked to guess the cake's weight over the past few months and the person who came closest was Margaret Doyle from Patrickswell. She won a prize of a weekend in London for two sponsored by Paul Buckley plus £200 spending money.

Deputy Mayor, Cllr. Jan O'Sullivan, was at the official weighing of the cake at Limerick Prison at the weekend and she rang Ms. Doyle from there with the good news.

The second prize went to Phyllis O'Dwyer from Ballynanty. She won a weekend in Dublin with £100 spending money sponsored by the Castle Oaks House and the Glentworth Hotels.

The "guess the weight" fundraiser was in aid of the Limerick branch of Cerebral Palsy, Ireland. Each guess cost £1.

The cake, baked by Sandra Drew of the Dane's Bakery was locked in a glass box and the key was held by the Governor of Limerick Prison, Mr. Bill O'Keefe, until the official weigh-in. Present at the scales was Garda Inspector Val Rooney, who confirmed the weight of the Treaty Stone Cake.

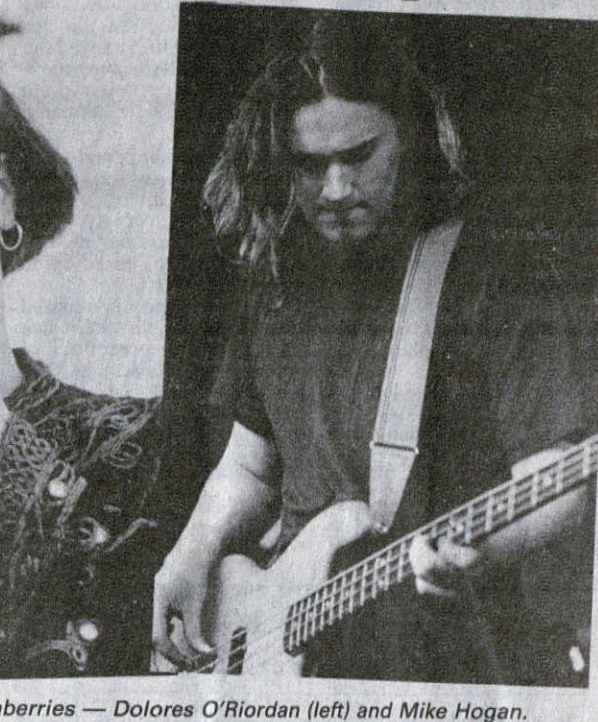

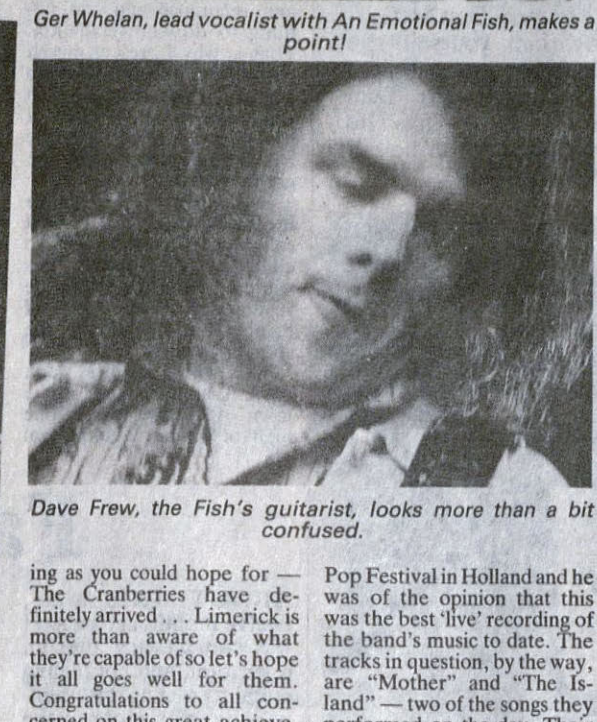
